Motion No. 7 – ENGLAND

Reasons behind England's motion:

This would be a similar arrangement to the ICSC World Open run alongside the ICSC World Individual/Junior/Deaf-Blind tournaments.

This would give members of other deaf chess clubs the opportunity to enjoy the experience of an ICSC event.

For example, looking at England, London Deaf Chess Club regularly compete in the Europa Cup so if this motion is passed then Sheffield Deaf Chess Club would be given the chance to play alongside the main event and be able to socialise with other deaf chess players from around Europe.

A few other countries may be in the same situation as England.

More teams involved means more deaf chess players so raising the atmosphere and profitability of the event.

Motion No. 8 – ENGLAND

“All ICSC events to be FIDE-rated where applicable”.

Reasons behind England’s motions:

Historically, ICSC events have been FIDE-rated on an on-and-off basis.

For example, looking back over the last 4 years;

2004 ICSC World Individual (Malente, Germany) - FIDE-rated? YES

2005 ICSC Europa Cup (Slovakia) - FIDE-rated? NO

2006 ICSC World Team (Hungary) - FIDE-rated? NO

2007 ICSC Europa Cup (Primorsko, Bulgaria) - FIDE-rated? YES

Getting ICSC events regularly FIDE-rated will give as many deaf chess players the opportunity to achieve a FIDE-rating. This is more especially so with the 7 (in total) game rule to get a FIDE-rating for ICSC/IBCA/IPCA members instead of 9 games for everybody else.

Now that ICSC have achieved their aim of 100 FIDE-rated players affiliated to the ICSC, the time is ripe for a new aim: 200 FIDE-rated players.
