Leaders speeding up

As we predicted it was a real bloodshed in top matches in both competitions. This time ladies come first. Two leading teams switch on higher speed. Russia crushed Slovakia with 3:0 and Ukraine was also efficient (2,5 points) against Romania but not that much, so the gap between these two teams is now 1 point.

On the third place is now USA, they defeated India with 2,5:0,5, followed by Hun-



gary, 2,5:0,5 against Estonia, and Georgia who even managed to cash all three points against Mongolia. Behind them are Bulgaria, 1,5:1,5 with China and Slovenia who defeated convincingly Spain with 2,5:0,5. Among first ten are still China, Vietnam and Latvia.

The standing on the top is: Russia 17,5, Ukraine 16,5, USA 15,5, Hungary and Georgia 15,0, Bulgaria and Slovenia 14,5, China, Vietnam and Latvia 14,0 points.

Top pairings for round eight are: Russia-USA, Hungary-Ukraine, Georgia-Bulgaria, Vietnam-Slovenia and China-Latvia.

It was not a lucky day for Italian teams. Italy «A» lost to Ecuador 2:1 and «B» lost to Portugal even worse 0,5:2,5.

Men were even more in a mood for fight in order to try to improve their positions. Two games on first boards ended in a very unusual way after only 19 moves. In the

most important match Sokolov lost to Aroonian with White making a decisive mistake already on move 10(!), while Aleksandrov lost to Kramnik even one move earlier. His last move, at least according to their score-sheets and what was seen on the screens will be certainly a serious candidate for the most absurd move of this Olympiad.

With one more win from Sargissian on board four, Armenians won their match against Netherlands with 3:1 thus enlarging their lead for half a point. They are now 1 point ahead of Russia who defeated with the same result Belarus.

A biggest jump forward in this round was made by Cuba who cashed 3,5 points against Indonesia, whose players probably lost their concentration after a terrible natural catastrophe (strong earthquake) with thousands of victims occurred in their country. Cubans are now third, just half a point behind Russia. Behind them, four teams are on 19,0 points: Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Georgia and Czech Republic. First two of them were on the top from the very beginning, other two are newcomers. Uzbekistan, Georgia and Czech Republik won with same 3:1 result against Brazil, Poland and Israel, while Ukraine, thanks to the win of Karjakin against Harikrishna, scored a very important victory against the strong Indian team.

It means that we have now the following situation on the top: Armenia 21,0 points, Russia 20,0, Cuba 19,5, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Georgia and Czech Republic 19,0, Netherlands, Sweden, USA, Denmark, France and Germany 18,5 points.

Top pairings for round eight are: Cuba-Armenia, Czech Republic-Russia, Uzbekistan-Georgia, Sweden-Ukraine, France-Netherlands, Denmark-USA and Belarus-Germany.

Italian teams did well yesterday. «A» team won 2,5:1,5 against Portugal thus revenging women, while «B» and «C» team played 2:2 against Macedonia (FYROM) and Costa Rica.

Today we shall see whether this men tournament risks to become a race for two teams (Armenia, Russia) like by women (Russia, Ukraine), or they will be stopped and joined by some other teams.

Anand wins ACP title

On Friday 26 May, the Botvinnik room at the Village saw the award ceremony for the winner of the ACP Tour 2004-2005: Vishy Anand won the sculpture entitled "The winner" specially created by the sculptor Giovanni Mason of Como. Attending the prize presentation were all the members of the executive of the Association of Chess Professionals in the presence of a knowledgeable public. Before and after the handing over of the prize, the President of the ACP GM Pavel Tregubov, former President Joel Lautier, GM Alexey Shirov and other members of the executive, including Italian WGM Elena Sedina, reported on the work carried out in the last few years and on the future aims of the Association of Professionals. At the core of the debate were the questions which lie closest to the hearts of the GMs on the international circuit: thinking times, the regularity of the various cycles of the world championship and the stability of regulations. In this context the ACP recognises that in recent times Fide has been more collaborative and has paid more attention to the problems on the table, but the ACP asks to be consulted on a more organised basis on matters that directly concern professional GMs.

The vice-president of Fide Georgios Makropoulos then took the floor, underlining his own and the Federation's desire to promote a dialogue with ACP in a climate of collaboration but also of respect for the pre-

rogatives of each. In particular, he said that it is highly unlikely that Fide will go back on its decision about thinking time, while he reassured listeners that the next world title candidates matches would take place regularly. He said that it was only because the Fide executive is under renewal that offers for candidates matches are still frozen, but that after the elections of 2 June, various likely organisers will most certainly come forward. GM Yasser Seirawan, who spoke in the name of the candidate for the Presidency of Fide Bessel Kok, offered another opinion to that of Makropoulos. Seirawan was more open about his recognition of the central



position of Grand Masters, the true "heroes of chess" without whom enthusiasts, players and the entire chess community could not survive, and he recalled that the golden age for professionals was that of the GMA tournaments organised by Bessel Kok at the end of the Eighties.

During the time it took the train to make the journey, Veronika played 30 moves, running

up and down the dingy corridor, dodging between telecameras from various TV stations, including RAI, and the flashes of the photographers who followed the exhibition for the entire duration of the journey.

In attendance for Trenitalia were Marco Raimondi (Public Relations) and Paolo Russo (Press Office), Ernesto Garcia (High Speed Marketing), who had come from Milan (Raimondi) and Rome (the other two) on purpose for the simul.

Great enthusiasm expressed by everybody at the end and congratulations to Veronika for her spectacular exhibition: this is perhaps the first simul to be held on a train, certainly it is the first on an Italian high speed train.

We also welcome contributions from chess journalists and often grandmasters send in some interesting games.

The idea of starting a chess daily struck me in 2000 Chess Olympiad at Istanbul and although I was able to do it there, we had some technical Internet problems; back home I managed to improve the output and to rope in a team of experts. We are always under pressure to meet daily deadline but in the past 6 years we have been late only 3 or 4 times.

We have a plan to make a weekly edition which will be a roundup of the events happened in the past 7 days. We are also planning to include more games and we have good relations with Chessbase since we follow their format. Chess Today is a unique product and we also plan to release the bulk of material in two DVD containing book reviews and coverage from 2000 to 2006. I welcome Grandmasters to Chess Today and they can email me to Baburin "hotmail.com". We have a mailing list with Yahoo and soon we will have our own server. All these years I have been concerned with the quality of the product and now we will work to triple our subscriptions.

Kramnik, Vladimir (2729) Aronian, Levon (2756) [A30]

Vladimir Kramnik's comeback was probably the main news of the first five rounds of the 2006 Olympiad. He played three games, making a draw with Black against Bu Xiangzhi and defeating with White the winner of Dortmund-2005, Naiditsch and the winner of Linares-2006, Aronian. **1.Nf3 Nf6 2.c4 b6!?** **3.g3 c5 4.Bg2 Bb7 5.0-0 g6** [Lately this move was somewhat more popular at the top level than the alternative 5...e6, which leads to different positions known as "hedgehog" system.] **6.d4** [6.Nc3 Bg7 7.d4 cxd4 8.Qxd4 just transposes.] **6...cxd4 7.Qxd4 Bg7 8.Nc3 d6!** [More accurate than 8...0-0 which allows 9.Qh4! d6 10.Bh6] **9.Rd1** [Here 9.Qh4 can be met by 9...h6!; while 9.Be3 Nbd7 10.Rac1 Rc8 11.b3 a6 12.Rfd1 transposes to the game.] **9...Nbd7 10.Be3** [This is a more topical setup than 10.b3 Rc8 11.Bb2 (Karpov-Kasparov, London/Lenin-

grad m-23 1986).] **10...Rc8 11.Rac1 a6** [Or 11...0-0 12.Qh4 a6 13.b3, again transposing to the game line; instead, one little studied idea here is 11...Nc5!?] **12.b3 0-0 13.Qh4** [Less ambitious and less popular is 13.Qd2, Ivanchuk-Aronian, Morelia/Linares 2006.] **13...Rc7!?** [This is quite a popular 'tabia', which is actively discussed in the grandmaster's practice. Black's position is solid and, as there were no exchanges of pieces so far, he may hope to fight for the initiative if White doesn't play precisely. From another point of view, Black must deal with active ideas from his opponent such as Nd5 and Bh6.] **14.Bh3!?** [For the moment (and especially after the featured game was played!) it can be called the main move. Other theoretical moves in this position are 14.g4! and 14.Bh6.] **14...Qb8** [Sometimes Black tries 14...Re8, while the standard 14...Qa8? is refuted here by 15.Bxd7! (now one can see why the bishop can be more

useful on h3 than on g2) 15...Rxd7 16.Na4± Anand-Gomez Esteban, Basque Country vs World (rapid) 2003.] **15.Bg5!?**



[A novelty. Many chess fans can not 'forgive' Kramnik for his unwillingness to give a revenge match to Garry Kasparov after 2000 (or/and for ignoring the rights of Alexei Shirov at the time when Kramnik agreed to play against Kasparov in 2000). Kramnik might have been right or wrong in these situations, but anyway he is the only guy who was able to beat Kasparov in a match and would remain great even he retired right now. But is Vladimir still able to play great chess? Not many conclusions can be made after only three games, but what we have seen until now resembles Kramnik at his very best. So, we may hope that his match versus Topalov will be exciting.] 1-0

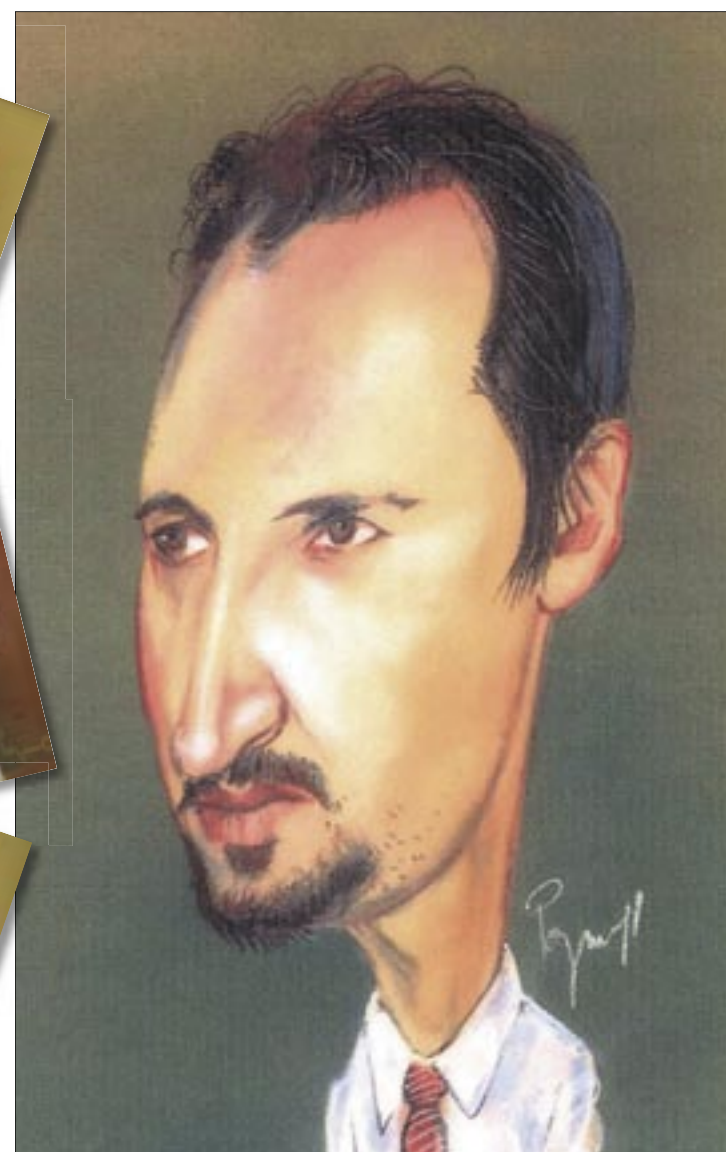
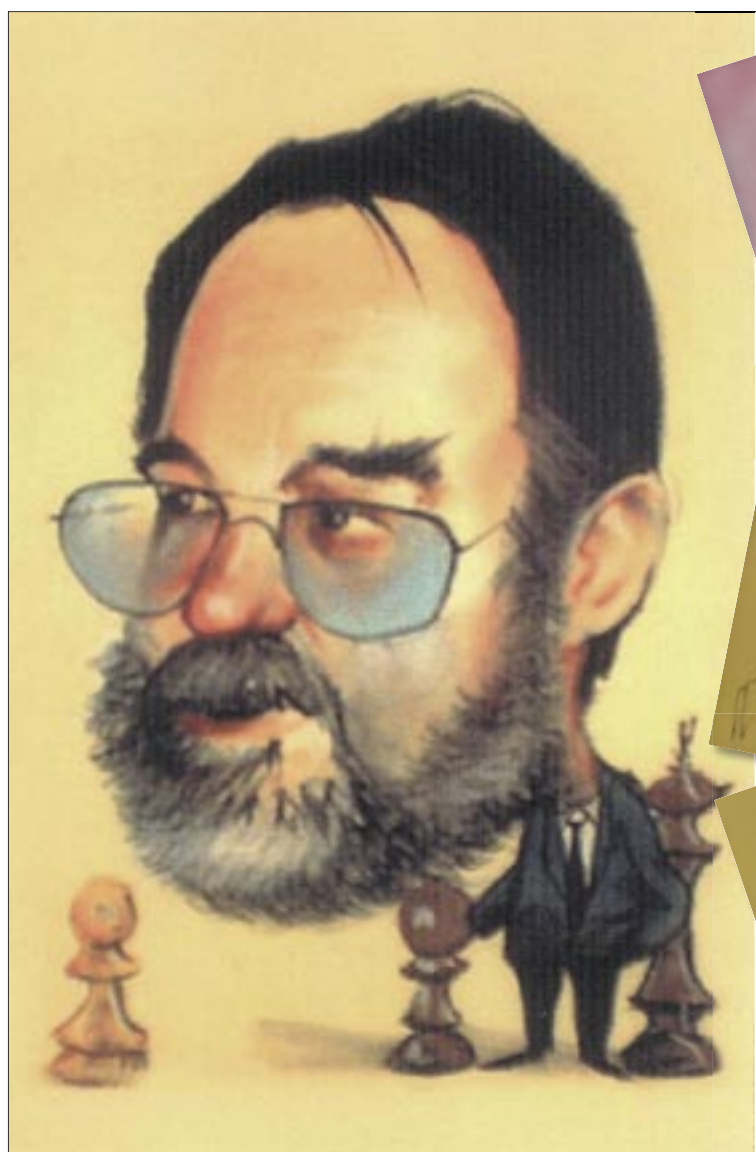
